Notes from the meeting will be compiled and shared in a following email, so that members unable to make the original meeting will be able to glean from the conference experience. Likewise, the connections made with student leaders at neighboring medical and health professional schools will allow for further collaboration and help the DCF e-board brainstorm on new event ideas and improve weekly meetings. For example, last year, a Downstate alumnus we connected with at CMDA spoke at a DCF meeting later in the spring, and during the conference, we received information of a summer medical program that we were able to pass along to the Downstate community. This year, we also expect to invite a Downstate alumnus involved with CMDA to speak at Sex and Medicine week.

Overall, many attendees in the years past have spoke of the experience as a source of encouragement, bringing back to Downstate a renewed focus and clarity of purpose. We hope and expect that this conference will have lasting effects on the way attendees approach school and their future careers in healthcare, making them more humble, sensitive to others, and ready to serve.
