- 5. There will be photobooths, DJ, Etc.
- iii. Food budget for Leadership Training Event
 - 1. Allocated budget was already depleted in early fall.
 - 2. Upcoming training will have bagged lunches as a means to reduce costs but additional funding is still needed
 - 3. Asking for \$2000 from both MC and UC
- iv. Basketball Court Maintenance Fees
 - 1. SUNY will not pay to have the basketball courts redone until 2026
 - 2. This is because there is currently an 8 million dollar project ongoing focused on fixing all of the leaks on the Downstate campus.
 - 3. SUNY has agreed to completely redo the basketball courts after this project
 - 4. Given this situation the proposed plan is to "maintain" the basketball courts so that it can be used by the students
 - 5. This plan includes "fixing" the current leaks by using padding
 - 6. Utilizing buckets every night and having cleaners to remove bucks
 - 7. Ensuring that no puddles build up
 - 8. Current estimates for this plan are around \$20,000 25,000.
 - 9. We are asking all of the councils to contribute, specifically asking MC to contribute up to \$7500.
- v. Student Activities Refund
 - 1. Medical council will need to make a decision regarding student activities fee refunds to students by the March meeting.
 - 2. Currently there is a build up of approximately 2 years worth of fees.
 - 3. The fee is \$210 per year (105 per semester)
 - a. The totality of this student fee is split between all of the councils.

2. Class Updates

- a. 2022
 - i. No major updates
 - ii. We will match in less than a month!!!
 - iii. Aaron has matched urology!!!
 - iv. Match Day
 - 1. Guest Allowance
 - a. Allowance of guest being permitted to attend match day has not been clarified yet.
 - b. Students may need to register who they want to bring to the event.
 - c. We also need to ensure that the auditorium is never at

- capacity.
- d. AAMC has also sent out a survey to medical schools regarding the specific proceedings schools are adapting for their Match Day's
- e. Possible vaccination requirements for guests will be announced.

b. 2023

- i. Career advisory dean meeting
 - 1. Overall most people have streamlined the process
 - 2. No major issues these meetings have been helpful
 - 3. Very functional meetings where as the prior meeting have not been
 - 4. Student historically have been dissatisfied with the clinical advisory meetings
 - a. Previous focus groups showed that students would want more advice
 - i. Ex I am getting married when is the best time to that
 - ii. For this reason we assigned career advisors/early career advisors
 - iii. As we progressed these advisory meetings have been happening earlier and earlier in a medical school
 - iv. Career advisors = first two years
 - v. Clinical advisors = later two years
 - 5. Take everything with a grain of salt with clinical deans
 - a. What you are told from
- ii. Graduation for the class of 2023
 - 1. Know its a very polarizing topic right now
 - 2. There is no contract for the next year
 - 3. There has never been the case
 - 4. Carnegie hall will likely not happen again
 - 5. We are pursing locations to see
 - 6. A majority of the class has communicated that they would rather not graduate from Coney Island
 - a. This also depends what the alternatives are
 - b. The only reason we choose this venue is to avoid any restrictions should COVID rise again
 - c. This is the only covered outdoor venue available
 - d. Currently it is medicine and grad studies
 - e. And health profession and nursing for the split of graduation ceremonies

c. 2024

 - 1. Downtate and affiliate hospitals are also holding us responsible

- iii. Students are wondering if and how they can get more feedback from previous summatives so that students can learn how to improve
 - 1. This is especially the case
 - 2. There have been a lot of challenges regarding that
 - 3. There's been discrepancies with what they hear back from academic advising
 - 4. We have surveyed our class and have some feedback from that we will pass along to administration
- iv. Recently met with Bianchi regarding communication and support for those who are not following the curriculum
 - 1. There are definitely a lot of people who are not following
 - 2. The need for more feedback after summatives and outside of the unit
 - 3. If you email the right people you may be able to get your NBME breakdown
 - 4. Students that need accommodations
 - a. There was a lot of chaos during Unit 2 for students that needed additional help
 - b. This has been an ongoing issue for various members of our class
- v. Overall students should have access to their exam breakdown so that they know how to proceed for subsequent units
 - 1. Scheduling this kind of a meeting is also particularly difficult

- a. Advisors late to meeting, scheduling during class, etc.
- vi. Overall students want to know if they should be continuing with approaching the curriculum the way that they do
- vii. The response from advisors overall is that its on the students if they follow outside resources rather than the curriculum.
- viii. Tests are really important for Downstate students but we get little to no feedback regarding them
- ix. There needs to be a communication to students that they can get this feedback/breakdown should they want on their exams
- x. NBME is specific on how we can distribute exam breakdowns to students
- xi. Those students with an ID are being tracked consistently
 - 1. Those that are on the cusp are also being tracked but not as strictly
- 3. Plan create a slack channel to be able to hash out these issues
