 - a. The federal government is only making the booster only available through pharmacies we need to request approval for distribution to students
 - b. This is something we need to revisit
 - c. There will be communication regarding this to students once a clear answer is reached
 - d. We recommend that all students, should they have access to the vaccine, take it (CVS, local pharmacies, etc.)
 - 2. Flu Vaccines
 - a. This will be occurring closer to October
 - 2. Social Security Card Kings County
 - 1. Kings County recently changed their requirements for rotating students to include submission of social security numbers

- a. Update Kings County has since removed the requirement for social security cards for onboarding for students
- b. Issue created confusion across the board, but the requirement has been removed and resolved.
- c. 2025
 - 1. UWORLD ORDER
 - 1. Email was received today
 - a. Sent by Ms. Lee to MC2025
 - b. UWORLD will be received in the next 3 days
 - 2. Tutoring for Unit 5 and 6
 - 1. The latest is that financial forms for tutors have only recently been submitted.
 - 2. Student were being hired as independent contractors which caused a prolonged process to hire tutors
 - 3. There is a new protocol for tutors not part of work study to be hired efficiently
 - 3. Tutoring Eligibility for Remediated Students
 - 1. Is there a policy for students that have had to remediate to be selected as tutors?
 - 2. The criteria that has been unofficially established is that if you remediate a class you are not eligible to be a tutor.
 - a. There was a specific case where a student was hired but then the offer was rescinded given that they had to remediate a unit.
 - b. Dean Putman will advocate for said student
 - 4. STEP 1 Support Session
 - Are there any ongoing STEP 1 support programs in place for students?
 a. AOA has a tutoring program for STEP 1
 - 2. Is the Medical Council allowed to use funds to contribute towards STEP 1 support?
 - a. Study resources are not outrightly permitted cannot be specifically academic
 - b. Would a workshop be possibly funded? This is a further conversation
 - 5. Bedside Experiences
 - 1. Lack of standardization across the board
 - a. Addending, evaluations, clinical exposure
 - b. There is a learning objective attached to each exposure
 - c. Faculty recognizes that student experiences are not the same across the board, but we are working to make sure there is a standard experience between all sites and requirements for each student are being fulfilled
 - d. If there are cases where clinical exposure necessary to fulfill bedside requirements are not being met, students are to directly reach out to Dr. Ovitsch.
 - 2. A site (Brookdale) told students that they needed to pay for their own background checks
 - a. This issue was since resolved
 - b. This was based off of Brookdale administration miscommunication
 - c. This was not a Downstate sided issue

- 6. Brooklyn Hospital
 - 1. Charges \$40-50 dollars to students for UA
 - 2. Their registration office is oddly timed, making it hard for students to get cleared in a timely fashion
 - 3. Badge access and EMR access has been repeatedly denied to students
 - 4. Scrub access has also been denied for multiple students
 - 5. On average, students miss $\frac{1}{6}$ of their rotation at these sites for this reason
- 7. Shuttle Schedule
 - 1. Students should be made aware that there is a rigid shuttle schedule for specific sites
- 8. Absence Policies
 - 1. Does presenting at a conference count towards your allotted 2 absences per unit?
 - a. Deans will find out and get back to students regarding this
 - b. According to admin there is no such thing as an excused or unexcused absence, it is a reported or unreported absence.
 - c. Emergency absence the form must be submitted as soon as possible
 - i. i.e. sickness, death etc.
 - ii. if you do it the next day, it is acceptable, but you need to do it as soon as you can
 - d. POPS Late Attendance
 - i. There have been moments where students have to leave POPs 30 min earlier and thus miss attendance and does not receive credit for attending.
 - ii. The attendance policy for POPs has been an issue for a while

- d. 2026
 - 1. Discussion of change to summatives: MK and PC together, with no break. No break for a 3hr 45min exam with no water or food allowed.
 - 1. No stop the clock bathroom breaks.
 - a. For students with accommodations, they have to sit through a 6 hour test day with no break, no food, no water.
 - b. Some students have medical conditions that is incompatible with no break, food, or water for such a long time
 - c. Proposal: Include stop the clock bathroom breaks, allow water/sealed food in the room so we can eat them during breaks without going to our locker

- 4. The school follows proctor rules for non-NBME facilities
- 2. Accommodations
 - 1. Students have been denied accommodations by proctors
 - a. Proctors will be made aware that approved accommodations must be followed
- Discussion of formative on Monday of summative week and it's on Rosh Hashanah
 - 1. Proposal: Move to open the formative on Thursday evening, closing on Friday evening
 - a. Will also accommodate people who observe Rosh Hashanah
 - b. Students also would prefer a Friday to Saturday formative open period
 - c. There are so many options so that students will not have formatives on the Monday of Summative week.
- 4. Discussion of formatives in general
 - 1. Monday is usually very busy, we have been having 30 min break in a full day of classes from 9-5 for the past few weeks.
 - 2. Difficult to perform well after such long days.
 - 3. Proposal: Move formative to open on Sunday afternoon, closing on Monday evening.
 - a. Flexibility for students to take it on the weekends or choose to take it on Monday during business hours in case they need help from faculty
- 5. Summative Exams
 - 1. If you are in an emergency situation or you are unable DO NOT START AN EXAM
 - 2. You are allowed to retake/reschedule the exam for the summer
 - 3. You cannot fail another unit in this case, because having to retake two sets of exams and will likely be pushed back
 - 4. The summer scheduling of exam retakes are also on a case by case basis
 - a. Students have had back to back unit exams vs having a grace period between exams for summer exams
 - 5. The appeals process regarding exams/remediation is not standardized
- 6. Academic Support Specifically for Medical School
 - 1. Why is Academic Support shared amongst all the schools?
 - 2. Is it possible for there to be an academic support advisor dedicated for the medical school.
 - 3. Can there be school specific liaisons?
 - 4. No one is currently happy with academic support
 - a. The entire approach of academic support is not effective
 - b. The people that are succeeding are doing so in spite of the academic support office

- 5. Can we possibly meet with Dr. Langley?
 - a. Can we submit questions to Dr. Langley beforehand?
- 6. SLC for 2025 is having monthly meetings with all of the deans present
- 7. Town Halls
 - 1. Town Halls are continued to be virtual

I have been accepted to present two original research abstracts at AACAP 2022. I have also just submitted a manuscript expanding on these projects to a psychiatry journal. I would greatly appreciate any funding to help me be able to share our results with the child and adolescent psychiatry community because I intend to pursue this career field. I am applying for psychiatric residency this cycle.

I have saved on registration costs by becoming a student member of AACAP and agreeing to monitor (checking badges and tickets, helping speakers, etc) for the conference. Downstate's psychiatry department is unable to contribute any funding. I applied for the AACAP Life Members Mentorship Grants for Medical Students but was not chosen for the award. The Alumni Association has agreed to cover \$1,000 in flight and ground transportation costs, one day's food, and the cost of one night's hotel stay. It is the Alumni Association's policy to not cover poster printing fees and more than one night's stay at a hotel. I am thus asking MC to fund the printing costs for two posters plus 2 travel tubes to save on shipping costs. I am also asking MC to fund three nights' stay so I am able to attend all events I will monitor for, as well as medical student networking events.

Short Description:

The primary purpose of this project is to describe the planning, implementation, and execution of summer medical student externship program in orthopedic surgery for first-year medical students, with the specific goals of diversifying the field and providing opportunity, mentorship, and guidance for women and underrepresented minorities. We will describe a summer program at NYU's Orthopedic Department as a case study for supporting women and underrepresented minorities' exposure to orthopedic surgery, a pipeline of diversification within the field, and model for fostering medical student-attending mentorship.

Submitted this version (499 words):

Background:

Although women graduating medical school has dramatically increased over the last decades, orthopedic surgery continues to struggle in attracting women to the field. The percentage of women entering orthopedic residency persistently remains at 14% despite near equal ratios of women to men in medical school classes.

Early exposure pipeline programs such as the summer medical student externship program in orthopedic surgery (SMEPOS) can aid to shift these statistics. Traditionally, orthopedic surgery has consisted of a homogenous physician population with white males dominating the field for decades. Recent endeavors, including those by the NYU Orthopedics Department, have provided successful gateways for women and under-represented minorities to embark on careers in orthopedic surgery. The primary purpose of this project is to describe the planning, implementation, and execution of SMEPOS for first-year medical students, with the specific goals of diversifying the field and providing opportunity, mentorship, and guidance for women and underrepresented minorities.

Methods:

Students between their first and second years of medical school were enrolled in SMEPOS for a 6-8 week experience. All students were assigned a faculty preceptor who works as a practicing orthopedic surgeon. Barring restrictions from COVID-19, students were able to shadow their preceptor in the office and the operating room to provide early exposure to clinical orthopedics.

Students were required to attend weekly didactic sessions, including informal Q&A sessions with residents and faculty. In addition, orthopedic subspecialty presentations were given by faculty in lecture format. The research projects were not required to be completed at the end of the summer; however, all students gave a 5-minute slide presentation of their work during a culminating virtual summer research symposium attended by members of the orthopedic department. Additionally, the program reserves at least six program spots to "underrepresented in orthopedics" students and provides diversity scholarships for students who otherwise might not be able to participate in the program due to financial constraints.

Results and Outcomes:

There were a total of 91 students from 38 different medical schools around the country and world that took part in the program from 2020-2022. Of these, 46 students identified as female (50.5%). 64 students, including the women, identified as an underrepresented minority in orthopedic surgery (68%). Students attended a virtual Q&A panel focusing on barriers to women in orthopedics and were engaged to ask questions and participate with female and male members of the faculty regarding their viewpoints on the topic. There was

overall very high satisfaction with the program with the in-person operating room experience being rated the highest.

Conclusions/Implications:

SMEPOS can serve as a case study for other institutions and medical educators and students interested in a model for how to diversify orthopedics and other competitive specialties as well as serve as an early pipeline for medical students who may be interested in a program's residency.

Areas for Follow-Up/Additional Study:

Future follow ups could examine how this model could be implemented in public medical institutions and other private academic medical centers as well as tracking speciality matches of program alumni.
