- 2. New Issues:
 - a. Lack of credit after three months of aways for specific specialities. Possibility of more aways counted for more credits.
 - i. Dr. Lazar recommends to get extra aways potentially through research electives, specifically clinical research, as they do not count as part of the three. It has been difficult to change this now as the next Deans Council meeting is not till the end of May. Dr. Lazar will bring this

up with the Education Leadership Committee.

- a. With new leadership for the MS4 radiology requirement (is this accurate?), will the requirement continue to be asynchronous remote?
 - i. According to Dr. Lazar there will be new leadership and it is being worked on currently with the Chair of Radiology at Maimonides. Potentially two months away. They met Thursday and they are assessing his responsibilities with Maimonides. It is expected, not definite, to be remote.
- b. Anesthesia home sub-I not guaranteed before eras is due. No home sub-I offered in July (so 15 spots approx 25 students)
 - i. Dr. Lazar had no idea it was that number or Maimonides was not taking. Dr. Lazar said he would get back to us on that and to send him an email and give him a week.
- c. OB, Maimonides is not responding to requests for aways by
 - i. Dr. Lazar will follow up on this. Dr. Lazar said to send him an email today or tomorrow.
- d. For people who delayed rotations, do they get two extra points for their shelf exam?
 - i. Dr. Lazar will confirm this.
- e. Are there international aways done without Downstate permission? How does that work?
 - i. Dr. Putman states if it is done it is not for credit.

1. Ongoing/Repeat Issues:

- a. Are there any updates on the success of CBSE? Does the data suggest that students were more prepared for step 1?
 - i. Dr. Lazar said as of Wednesday, 155 students took Step 1 and says the results compared to last year are remarkably better with no specific number able to be given. The pass rate now is respectable and cannot give an exact figure because 45 students have not taken it yet.

2. New Issues:

- a. Newly rotating students not having Healthbridge access at all.
 Coordinators and IT saying "we were supposed to get healthbridge training" that was never sent.
 - i. Dr. Lazar said there has potentially been a lot of talk regarding securing another EMR.
 - ii. Dr. Putman states "We are working expeditiously on this. They're streamlining the process to get this resolved as quickly as possible. This is an IT issue and the person who worked on this retired. We believe we have the resolution."

- a. Anatomy Exam Fairness & Grade Flexibility
 - i. Students felt the Unit 3 anatomy practical and RRE were overly harsh and tested obscure content not emphasized in class. The lack of partial credit and all-or-nothing questions were especially frustrating
 - ii. There is a request to review exam structure and grading policies, and to consider implementing a small curve or an optional assignment for borderline students to improve their grades
 - 1. Will be forwarded to SLC.
- Reconsider the ID grade in medical professionalism in light of school policy and student's documented medical needs. Also propose that the school provide clearer communication protocols when excused absences may still lead to academic consequences
 - i. Will follow up with Dean Putman regarding specific details of the issue.
