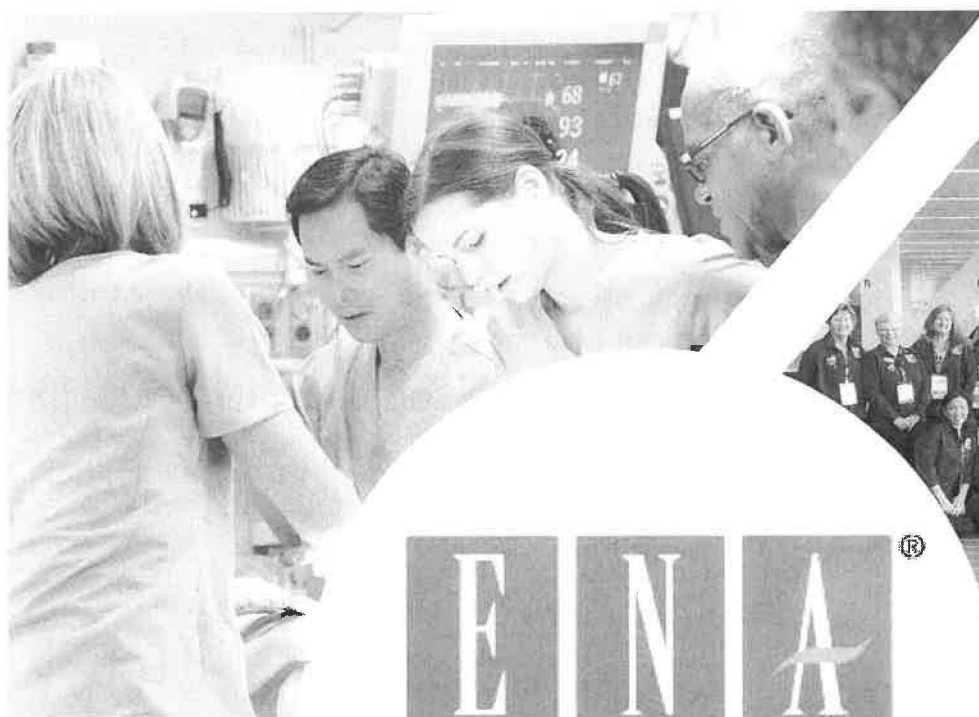

Evidenced Based Practice

NYSENA is seeking research and evidence-based practice abstracts that address emergency care issues including clinical, education and injury prevention for presentation at the 2019 conference.

The paper and poster sessions are focused on topics that are of interest and importance to nurses, managers, educators, researchers, and others who practice in emergency care settings.

Abstracts must reflect either completed projects or projects in the final stages of completion with results available for inclusion in the poster presentation. Suggested topics include, but are not limited to, abstracts which address clinical practice, education, research, injury prevention, quality & patient safety, trauma, government affairs, pediatrics, telephone triage, emergency medical services, forensics, etc. Authors may submit abstracts for more than one paper and/or poster.

ENA prefers to accept posters and papers from a variety of authors. A primary presenter is the individual who registers for the conference (registration is required) and who presents the paper or poster at the conference. This presenter will have their poster hung at the conference but the presenter does not need to stay at poster, they may attend classes at the conference.

Poster Awards Program: Sponsored by the NYSENA, the Poster Awards Program is open to all authors of presented posters (both ENA members and non-members). Two awards will be given out – one for the best Research poster, and one for the best Evidence-based Practice poster. To be eligible for this award, the poster must be set up at the start of the conference - NO exceptions.
