### II POLICY:

It is the policy of SUNY Downstate Medical Center that all department(s) within the Hospital will have the ability to share information / collaboration regardless of the software business application installed, therefore, the Eagle 2000 Admission/Discharge/Transfer System Uniform Data Dictionary will represent Hospital's standard.

The Eagle 2000 inpatient and Outpatient Registration and Patient Billing System's Uniform Data Dictionary is the designated Hospital Information System which will share patient's demographic, financial and clinical information with all hospital information systems and departmental The University Hospital of Brooklyn has a means to foster the ability for all Information Systems to have the capability to communicate with one another and support a comprehensive Hospital Information System (HIS) thus establishing this Uniform Data Definition policy to promotes system integration.
