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| TOPIC Assessment planning and SWOT Analysis Project: Focus Groups | Notes Since our last meeting on Nov 14, Mark, Lori B., Kane and Tina convened individuals nominated by the deans from each college/school for separate focused group discussions. A summary of the focus group results is in the works. Preliminary takeaways from the conversations revealed some emerging themes. These themes are not final but were recognized as points that were brought up repeatedly. Some emerging themes include: Strengthening the assessment feedback loop; use of assessment results Institution wide plan, policy, procedures, analysis for institutional and program effectiveness Data collection, storage, management, access, analysis, consistency, security, etc. Lack of a central repository for common institutional items alignment of program learning objectives with institutional objectives Surveys: course evaluations, low response rates, survey fatigue, usefulness, frequency, etc. Committee responsibilities vis-à-vis The institution works in silos resulting in duplication of effort. There is interest in sharing resources and working with one another to figure out what to do easier and better. Clinical assessment Next steps: Mark, Lori B., Kane and Tina will convene and compare notes on the focus group conversations and create a summary report on the findings. Review the assessment objectives of other peer and aspirational institutions including SUNY Upstate. Align with existing mission and vision and the new Impact 2030 strategic plan vis-àvis ILO's. Develop working crosswalk tables to demonstrate alignment of ILO's and other university priorities and objectives Nov 30th launched the kickoff of the Middle States self-study process Committees and Working groups have been created with Chairs and Co-chairs officially assigned. The Middle States Conference occurred in Philadelphia, Dec 6-9. Jeffery, Kane, and Tina attended on behalf of Downstate. OACC members asked for an update on the production timeline. See below. 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| Updates on accreditation projects in the colleges and schools: | CON, SPH, SOHP, COM are at various points in their accreditation cycles SPH submitted their preliminary self-study report at the end of November to CEPH. They expect to receive feedback in Mid-January, submit a final report in February and have a site visit in April 2023. COM has submitted their final draft follow up report to LCME on Dec 2 addressing 12 elements from the most recent site visit in 2020. They should receive feedback Feb/March and anticipate further monitoring on certain items. SoHP: Dean Lewis reports that accreditation activities are in full swing and well-managed in SoHP. Midwifery: a self-study report is due in February 2023 for a site visit in April 2023. Physical Therapy has a self-study report due in April 2023 for a site visit in June 2023. The self-study report is 95% complete. Physician's Assistant program is preparing a "modified self-study," due in July 2023 as a follow up to their prior evaluation. Feedback expected by October 2023 CON has their CCNE site visit in early 2025. Their big project right now is creating a resource room in Brightspace and developing Standard Operating Procedures (SOP's). |
| Suggested goals for future meetings | Create a plan to assess our assessment. Dean Lewis proposes using the Stufflebeam framework CIPP. Develop a core services taxonomy so that all at the institution are defining common data in a universal way. Creating a universal collection of data points between all schools with standard requirements that are centrally accessible. |
