2016 Alumni Reunion Scientific Program Target Audience

This program is designed for physicians of all specialties and health care professionals, (both active and retired) and all medical students.

Program Description

Based on identified patient needs as reported by the alumni board members and the 2015 scientific program evaluations, it was determined that this year's program would focus on the rationale and the bacteriology and antibiotic treatment of C Difficil entrocolitis, the range of cancers observed in HIV-infected people, their growing importance as a cause of morbidity and mortality in HIV-infected individuals, and the challenges faced in diagnosing and treating these malignancies in low resource areas , and the mechanism(s) of sudden death in epilepsy.

Objectives

As a result of attending this activity participants will be more able to: recognize uses of fecal transplant for antibiotic resistant infections, how to set up specific clinical trials in resource poor areas including those for HIV associated malignancies, and exposure to sudden death in epilepsy and addressing the symptoms with patients.
