Presiding Officer's Report

Nominations

<u>CEPC</u>

3) There will be a discussion on how well we are preparing students for the conduct of clinical research and the use of results in clinical decision-making.

New Business

Dr. Powderly stated that the Presiding Officer of the Executive Committee or his designee should attend the White Coat ceremony. Dr. Brown stated that he would discuss this with Jeffery Putman.
