## **Purpose**

- 1. LCME Element 9.1 requires non-faculty instructors (generally residents, fellows, M.D.-Ph.D. students in their research years, and near-peer instructors) to receive training and orientation in teaching and instruction, curricular goals, objectives, and assessments.
- 2. The dual identity (student vs. instructor) of near-peer instructors creates potential for conflicts of interest in grading. The purpose of this policy is to ensure non-faculty instructors receive instruction and training and avoid any conflicts of interests.
- 3. The Office of Education, in conjunction with the Curriculum Evaluation Committee, will provide centralized monitoring of non-faculty instructor teaching and assessments.

## **Policy**

- 1. The Office of Education provides orientation to teaching and to the SUNY Downstate curriculum. Credentials are extended to non-faculty instructors to teach in the Foundations of Medicine curriculum only if they have successfully completed the required training.
- 2. Unit directors who wish to use credentialed non-faculty instructors are required to provide training to the instructors in teaching the sessions to which they are assigned.
  - a. Session training must occur for activities for which attendance is taken. Course Directors are required to document such training.

- b. Non-faculty instructors, as part of training, must be informed of the curricular goals and learning objectives that are expected to be addressed in the sessions they will teach.
- c. Residents and fellows with academic appointments shall participate in non-faculty training except Residents and fellows with a rank of Assistant Professor.
- d. Such training must occur and shall be documented for each annual offering of a session.
- 3. To avoid conflicts of interest, near-peer instructors may not serve in roles that include summative assessment, e.g., PBL facilitation.

## **Implementation Method**

- 1. Teaching orientation/credentialing shall be implemented as determined by the Associate Dean for Educational Development.
- 2. Waivers of the credentialing requirement may be provided for residents and fellows who have received equivalent orientation in their training programs.
- 3. Unit directors must identify all non-faculty instructors teaching in their units and report them to the Office of Education using a form provided for the purpose.
- 4. Unit directors will document session instructor training in their units, flagging non-faculty instructors, using a form provided for the purpose.
- 5. During its annual review of each course, the Curriculum Evaluation Committee will examine the provided documentation and report on compliance with this policy to the Dean's Council for Education.
