The Accelerated BS in Nursing Program is a 15 month full time program open only to applicants who have earned a baccalaureate degree, in any discipline, by the date of enrollment and who have met the prerequisite and admission requirements by the start of registration.

Admitted students take 63 credits of concentrated nursing courses in residence at Downstate College of Nursing and transfer in 65 credits of pre-requisite courses to qualify for the BS degree with a major in nursing.

Upon successful completion of the program, graduates are eligible to take the National Council Licensing Examination for Registered Nurses (NCLEX-RN).

The curriculum of the Accelerated BS program is based on the American Association of Colleges of Nursing's Essentials document, delineating the outcomes expected of graduates of baccalaureate nursing programs. The program provides a sequence of professional nursing development that proceeds from understanding

the theoretical basis for professional nursing practice, to acquiring and applying knowledge and skills to the practice of professional nursing.

Students are introduced to a basic understanding of how evidence is developed, including the research process and prepares beginning practitioners to assume a variety of nursing roles in different healthcare settings with patients including individuals, families, groups, communities, and populations across the lifespan and across the health-illness continuum.

Individuals wishing to pursue advanced study will be eligible to apply for admission to any of our College of Nursing Master of Science Degree programs.

Admission Requirements

- A **baccalaureate degree** in any discipline from colleges or universities accredited by one of the following: The Middle States Commission on Higher Education (MSCHE), the New England Commission on Higher Education (NECHE), The Higher Learning Commission (HLC), the Northwest Commission on Colleges and Universities (NWCCU), the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges (SACSCOC), the Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC) Senior College and University Commission (WSCUC) or the Accrediting Commission for Community and Junior Colleges (ACCJC), United States Department of Education (USDE). If you have any questions about whether a transfer course will be accepted, you should check with the Office of Admissions prior to enrolling in the course.
- You must submit **two letters of recommendation**. SUNY Downstate Health Sciences University has moved toward exclusive use of electronic recommendation submissions. Your letters should be written by a current/former College Science Professor or an employer/supervisor, or another college professor. Recommendations by individuals other than your College Professor or Employer/Supervisor will **NOT** be considered. Please visit the application instructions to learn more about the letter of recommendation requirements.
- A **minimum** undergraduate cumulative Grade Point Average (GPA) of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale.
- ATI TEAS minimum acceptable passing scores for Math and Reading are 80%, a Science score of 80% is preferred.
- A grade of "C" or better in the following prerequisite courses:
