

Participation in the Annual Research Colloquium is mandatory for all students in the School of Graduate Studies in SUNY Downstate Health Sciences University who have reached their third year. It is encouraged for SUNY Downstate College of Medicine students, Public Health students, College of Nursing students, School of Health Professions students, post-doctoral fellows, graduate medical fellows, residents and undergraduates who are associated with SUNY Downstate Medical Center faculty members. Participants who are associated with SUNY Downstate Medical Center but are not students or employees may participate, but cannot compete for awards.

Eligibility is based on receipt of a full application (below) between **Monday, February 1st, 2022 and Wednesday, February 16th, 2022** and the recording of the presentation between **Wednesday, February 23rd and Wednesday, March 9th, 2022**. All presentations will be entered through the VoiceThread platform (Instructions here:

https://voicethread.com/myvoice/browse/threadbox/890/, and for examples, the 2021 Downstate Colloquium entries are here: https://www.downstate.edu/grad/ard/2021all.html). Presentations will be limited to a maximum 10 minutes each. Applicants will be able to record and edit their presentations until Wednesday, March 9th, 2022, at which point they will be made uneditable, so that judging can take place.

2022 Colloquium Awards

Faculty and alumni of Downstate Medical Center will judge the abstracts and presentations. The School of Graduate Studies will competitively award a number of travel awards ranging from up to \$250 to up to \$1000 to eligible student and employee participants. In addition, the School of Graduate Studies will print the posters of the entries that receive awards* to be shown at Annual Research Day 2022.

The deadline for this application is **February 16th at midnight**. **By submitting this application**, you declare your intention to record a presentation for 2022 Downstate Research Colloquium.

Special Instructions for this application: Only one entry will be honored per person for competition. If more than one entry is entered, the last entry (entry with the most recent date) will be the one used. In rare cases, the Dean will allow the display of an additional non-competitive presentation, but this must be prearranged. Joint presentations may be allowed, but are not considered for competition.

*Entries needn't be in "poster form" in VoiceThread. However, entries that receive awards will be invited to show their work on a poster at Annual Research Day 2022. If the work entered is not in poster form we will ask these presenters to reformat their entries as posters at that time.

THE ALFRED STRACHER STUDENT RESEARCH PRESENTATION AWARD

The Alfred Stracher Student Research Presentation Award was established to acknowledge students whose research, conducted at SUNY Health Sciences University and presented at Annual Research Day, translates to the improvement of human health.

Dr. Alfred Stracher, a SUNY Distinguished Professor, was a biochemist who developed molecules for the treatment of neuroinflammatory and neurodegenerative diseases. This award is intended to recognize the importance of basic research as a critical step in the development of diagnostic and therapeutic tools

to improve human health. The award will be given to a <u>student</u> conducting basic research which has the potential for translation to human subjects but is not ready for a clinical trial. Residents, postdoctoral fellows, and faculty are not eligible.

Each year, one student will be selected from the students presenting at Annual Research Day to receive a monetary award (\$500) and plaque.

Submission requirements

- 1. Research project must be basic research (not related to a clinical trial) that is presented as a poster or platform presentation at Annual Research Day.
- 2. Complete a ~200 word (1500 character maximum) brief essay on the potential translational impact of your research (below).
- 3. Be present for the judging of your work at Annual Research Day.
- 4. Finalists may be asked to submit a PDF copy of their poster or platform slides to the Alfred Stracher Award Committee.

The Alfred Stracher Student Research Presentation Award will be based on the highest combined scores from the judges' reviews of the Annual Research Day presentations along with faculty review of the brief essays.
