Medical Billing and Coding (Certificate)

Part-Time (evenings & weekends); In-Person/online



The Medical Billing and Coding certificate program run by the School of Health Professions (SOHP). is designed to assist individuals entering the field of medical billing and coding, or preparing for certification.

Medical Billing and Coding addresses how patient information is translated into insurance claims, so that healthcare facilities and providers can be properly reimbursed. Students acquire the skills to perform all coding duties, develop competence in coding regulations and determine accuracy of clinical documentation for reimbursement.

A certified Medical Coder earns approximately \$50–70K depending on location and experience. The foundation provided in this program also paves the way for upskilling in areas of practice such as:

- Certified Professional Medical Auditor (CPMA)
- Certified Physician Practice Manager (CPPM)

- Certified Documentation Ex-Pert Outpatient (CDEO)
- Certified Tumor Registrar (CTR).

The live program session begins in the Fall annually and the online session starts in January annually. Each session provides the skill development needed for a career as a certified coder in hospitals, insurance companies, physician's offices, and other health related facilities.
