The Physician Assistant is a professional member of the health-care team who is qualified by academic and clinical education to practice medicine with supervision of a licensed physician. Following a medical model of patient care, physician assistants are qualified to perform a wide range of duties traditionally performed only by physicians.

Physician Assistants obtain patient histories, perform physical examinations, diagnose illness, determine treatment plans, order and interpret laboratory, diagnostic and therapeutic procedures, and prescribe medication as well as provide patient education, counseling and follow-up care. The Physician Assistant's scope of practice is delegated according to the medical discipline of the supervising physician, practice setting, level of expertise and institutional guidelines.

Employed in all health care settings and in every medical and surgical specialty, Physician Assistants function to increase access and enhance the quality of patient care while contributing to medical cost containment. Demand for Physician Assistant services is steady, with approximately two to three employment opportunities for every new Physician Assistant graduate.

Accreditation, Credentialing and Licensure

The Accreditation Review Committee for Physician Assistant (ARCPA) has granted accreditation to the State University of New York (SUNY) Downstate Health Sciences University Physician Assistant Program. Continued accreditation status is granted when a currently accredited program complies with the ARC-PA Standards.

Admission Requirements

- A baccalaureate degree in any discipline from a college or university institutionally accredited and recognized by the Council for Higher Education Accreditation (CHEA).
- A minimum undergraduate cumulative Grade Point Average (GPA) of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale.
- A minimum of 500 hours of health-related experience.
- A minimum of 250 hours of non-clinical volunteer [community service] work.
- Three (3) letters of recommendation. At least one from a clinician (Physician Assistant, MD, Nurse Practitioner, etc).
- A grade of “B” or better in the following prerequisite courses (competitive applicants are those who have earned a “B+” or higher in the prerequisite science courses with labs):

Mathematics (not Remedial Math nor Statistics)	3

Abnormal Psychology or Life Span Psychology (birth to aging)**	3

Humanities or Social Sciences (Preferably writing intensive courses. Applicants may be required to submit a course description.)	6
Two Upper-Division Science course	6–8

* Courses accompanied with lab must be designated for science majors. Online courses will not be accepted towards the fulfillment of the science courses and must be completed within eight (8) years prior to your planned date of matriculation.

** More than one course may be required to fulfill the Life Span Psychology prerequisite.

*** One course **MUST** be Biochemistry, Organic Chemistry, Pathophysiology, Genetics, or Pharmacology. These courses are generally physical/life science courses numbered 300 or higher. They require prerequisite course and are typically completed at 4-year institutions. Applicants should consult with the registrar’s office at their institution to be sure the course is upper-division. Upper-division science courses completed at a community collegewill be accepted. However, applicants may be required to submit proof of the upper-division status of the course.

Recommended Additional Courses: Organic Chemistry, Genetics, Biochemistry, , Pathophysiology, Nutrition, Pharmacology, Statistics Additional Upper-Division Biology Courses 300–400 level, Competitive applicants complete at least four (4) of the recommended courses.
