ADVOCATE AWARD

The **Advocate Award** focuses on positive, customer-centered outcomes and may be awarded to Downstate students and/or staff.

Jennifer Brown

Jennifer Brown is the Director of Operations at the Center for Healthcare Simulation. The Center for Healthcare Simulation provides immersive, simulation-based educational programs for students, clinical trainees, and faculty throughout Downstate.

Jennifer receives the Advocate Award for her efforts to continue education for students from the College of Medicine from October 2023 to the present under difficult circumstances. Taking on the responsibilities of a colleague who fell ill, Jennifer has advocated for the continuation of the evaluation and simulation of over 200 students annually. To accomplish this, she had to learn many new skills in a short period of time.

Coordinating the schedules of all students, faculty, staff and contractors requires good communication skills. It also took great ingenuity, empathy, patience, and creativity to fashion the programs and recruit all actors to participate in the assessments created. It took mental resilience, focused action, flexibility to develop solutions, and determination to complete the tasks.

Maria Jimenez is a Care Coordinator for the STAR Program. She receives the Advocate Award for exemplifying exceptional interpersonal skills and empathy in her interactions with patients, approaching each individual with a desire to understand their concerns and needs, and creating a comforting environment where they feel valued and heard. Mary Mallappallil, MD, FASN, FACP

Dr. Mary Mallappallil is an associate professor of clinical medicine, the chief of service for nephrology at Kings County Hospital, and the director of CME for the nephrology division at Downstate. Her areas of expertise are chronic kidney disease, glomerulonephritis, and dialysis. Dr. Mallappallil is the medical director at the Kings County Hospital dialysis center and chief of nephrology.

Dr. Mallappallil receives the Innovator Award for improving continuing medical education, which keeps practicing nephrologists up-to-date with information in the Brooklyn area.

James Hayes

James Hayes is the Associate Director for the Office of Financial Aid at Downstate, where he has worked for over 20 years.

In 2024, the federal financial aid form (FAFSA) was launched much later than expected, leaving all universities in a frenzy. The FAFSA affects a university's ability to offer financial aid packages to incoming students. This inability can also cause a school not to reach its full enrollment potential.

During this frenzy, James, who is receiving the Innovator Award, was steadfast in solving how Downstate could get the FAFSA to campus by engaging the IT Department daily, reading through all the Federal and SUNY updates, and attending countless seminars and roundtables to address the issue. To start the process in earnest, Mr. Hayes also manually processed some of the files to identify errors and find solutions.

As a result of his tireless efforts, Downstate produced award letters ahead of most of our SUNY colleagues. He took on this task head-on, making the matriculation of incoming and continuing students to Downstate seamless.

LEADER AWARD

The **Leader Award** focuses on contribution to the SUNY Downstate mission, values, and/or Strategic Plan by leading or directing a successful group or project. It may be awarded to Downstate students and/or staff.

Robert Foronjy, MD, PhD

Dr. Robert Foronjy is an Associate Professor in the Department of Medicine and Chief of the Pulmonary and Critical Care Division. After graduating from Temple Medical School in 1995, Dr. Foronjy completed his internal medicine residency and pulmonary and critical care fellowship training at Columbia University Medical Center. In 2001, he joined the faculty at Columbia and began his career in basic and translational science. This research focused on better understanding the pathogenesis of chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD). His work on redox biology of the lung was awarded an NIH grant, and, in 2011, he became the Director of Lung Research at St. Luke's Roosevelt Medical Center.

In 2015, Dr. Foronjy, receiving the Leader Award, accepted the position as Chief of Pulmonary and Critical Care Medicine at Downstate. Here, his research group continues to work to identify the basic mechanisms of lung injury in COPD and other pulmonary diseases to develop better future treatments for patients. In addition, the research group is dedicated to training young faculty, fellows, residents, medical, and doctoral students in translational lung science.

Srikanth Adidam Venkata, MD

Dr. Adidam Venkata, who will receive the Leader Award, served as the Chief of Neurology in the Department of Neurology at Brookdale Hospital. He is currently a Fellow in Neurocritical Care at the Mayo Clinic in Florida.

Since Sri, as he is affectionately known, was one of the first classes of this neurology program at Brookdale, he helped create and document clinical practice protocols, assembled educational curriculum, and curated outside speakers for the "Lecture at noon" Conference.

Even before he took the role of chief, he started work as a one; he researched other neurology programs' handbooks and assembled one for this program. Sri hosted weekly resident meetings to discuss issues, difficulties, wellness, and suggestions for improvement.

Sri works closely with chiefs in other programs to collaborate and advocate for better patient care. Every medical resident prefers him and is comfortable approaching him for help with neurological questions in practice.

SYNERGIST AWARD

The **Synergist** Award focuses on SUNY Downstate team(s) who have worked together, within or across departments, to accomplish goals serving the greater good through the spirit of Downstate's mission, values, or strategic goals. It may be awarded to a team of Downstate students, staff, or a team combining both.

University Hospital at Downstate Care Management Team

This year's **Resiliency Award** winner for staff **Synergy** is The University Hospital at Downstate Care Management Team, which includes an amalgamation of Social Work and Case Management.

At the heart of the hospital's mission, the Care Management team's work is invaluable to patients and the broader community. The team expertly manages complex patient discharges, creating culturally sensitive plans in collaboration with every hospital department, community partner, and patient's family. They are known for their resilience and dedication, often working extra hours to ensure a safe transition for patients. Strong patient advocates are the vital link between the clinical team and the patient, providing additional support when needed. Their commitment to compassion, equality, and accountability ensures they are regarded highly by colleagues and patients.

Downstate's School of Health Professions Chapter of the Coalition of Occupational Therapy Advocates for Diversity (COTAD)

This year's **Resiliency Award** winner for student **Synergy** is The School of Health Profession's Chapter of the Coalition of Occupational Therapy Advocates for Diversity.

The Coalition of Occupational Therapy Advocates for Diversity (COTAD) was formed in 2014 through a collaboration between members of the AOTA Emerging Leaders Development Program. COTAD has grown tremendously since its early days and has added individuals to its Executive Board and general membership.

Now established as a non-profit organization, COTAD operates as a group of individuals from across the United States, all working towards promoting diversity and inclusion within the occupational therapy workforce and increasing occupational therapy practitioners' ability to serve an increasingly diverse population.

Downstate's COTAD chapter is an active student organization focused on bridging the values of advocacy and professionalism through increasing awareness of the importance of culture and diversity within the occupational therapy profession. The chapter is proudly student-developed, student-led, student-implemented, and student-driven, with a strong component of teamwork, leadership, and fostering professional values as its foundational structure.
