About the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990

The ADA, enacted in 1990, is a comprehensive civil rights law ensuring equal rights and opportunities for individuals with disabilities. It prohibits discrimination in various public areas such as employment, education, transportation, and public places accessible to all. Similar to other protected groups, the ADA provides individuals with disabilities with civil rights protections, promoting equal opportunities in public accommodations, employment, transportation, government services, and telecommunications. The ADA is organized into five titles, each addressing different aspects of public life.
