## Time-Off to Vote

- If you do not have <u>4 consecutive hours to vote</u>, either from the opening of the polls to the beginning of your working shift, OR
- Between the end of your working shift and the closing of the polls, you may
  take off up to <u>2 hours</u>, without loss of pay, to allow you time to vote if you
  are a registered voter.
- You may take time off at the beginning or end of your working shift, as your Supervisor may designate, unless otherwise mutually agreed.
- You must notify your Supervisor not less than 2 days, but not more than 10 days, before the day of the election that you will take time off to vote.
