

# Master of Public Health (MPH) in Healthcare Administration

42 Credits

The Master of Public Health Program (MPH) in Healthcare Administration will be offered on our Manhattan Campus starting Fall 2022. The Masters of Public Health in Healthcare Administration will prepare the next generation of healthcare leaders with the skills in healthcare management, strategic development and leadership, and systems improvement to achieve our goal for equitable access to quality healthcare.

MPH in Healthcare Administration degree candidates must complete the School of Public Health core requirements as well as the concentration requirements. The number of credits required for successful completion of the degree is 42. All students must complete an Applied Practical Experience that integrates theory and practice. Guaranteed fellowship placements in the healthcare sector are available through this concentration. Students can participate in courses in-person, online, or through hybrid learning options.

## Admission Requirements

- Bachelor's Degree from an accredited university.
- Official Copies of Transcripts ( Applicants who have completed all or part of their education abroad, are required to have a course-by-course educational credential evaluation completed by World Education Services -WES)
- Cumulative GPA of 3.0 or better (on a 4.0 scale) preferred.
- Two letters of recommendation from an employer or faculty member.
- Submission of the online application through SOPHAS and a personal statement essay. The essay serves as an opportunity to inform the admissions committee of your accomplishments, motivation, and goals that will make an impact on the health care organizations and communities you aim to serve.
- Minimum score of 79 on TOEFL exam for international applicants for whom English is not their first language.
- No GRE/GMAT scores required.
